Legal Pluralism — A Challenge for Human Rights? Perspectives from Palestine, Indonesia and Germany

Under the heading of "Law between Dialog and Translation," a project funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) was started between the universities of Göttingen (Germany) under the heading of Prof. Dr. Irene Schneider (Seminar of Arabic and Islamic Studies) and al-Ouds- University (East Jerusalem/Palestine) under the heading of Prof. Dr. Munir Nuseibah (Faculty of Law) in 2019. In 2021, the project's last year, a former DAAD-partner of Prof. Schneider, Prof. Dr. Noorhaidi Hasan of School of Graduate Studies of Sunan Kalijaga University (Yogyakarta) joined this cooperation.

The project in its scientific part aimed to analyze and understand how international human rights conventions such as the UN Women's Rights Convention (CEDAW), the Rome Statute, International Humanitarian Law and others are "translated" into the national legislations in Palestine, Germany and Indonesia. The translational perspective takes into view not only the texts of those international conventions as such but especially the translation of different concepts, terms and ideas from one (legal) culture into another and deals with the question how this works and which problems arise in this procedure. International human rights on the one hand and national German, Palestinian and Indonesian law on the other are based on specific roots, historical developments and legal traditions and concepts that shaped the respective legal cultures and influence this translation process. The process is accompanied and impacted by negotiations and discourses within the different societies in which state and non-state actors participate and which, too, are object of the project's research focus.
